Tickets include access to the new Sackler Gallery, where you can learn how Thornhill created the Painted Hall and meet the many characters, including gods and heroes, shown on the ceiling.



Join one of our guided tours or use our fantastic new multimedia guide (available in 7 languages). Discover how the Painted Hall was designed to celebrate England's naval power, prosperity and monarchy, alongside its history since, including the site where Admiral Nelson was laid in state, naval officers dined, and blockbuster movies were shot.

Take a tour of Sir Christopher Wren's landmark buildings, designed as a home for retired seamen. Explore the magnificent architecture, wander our atmospheric grounds, hear the stories of the people who made this place their home, marvel at the exquisite 18th-century Chapel of St Peter and St Paul and the famous Water Gates, or try your hand at getting a strike in the Victorian Skittle Alley.



Former home to Greenwich Palace and birthplace of King Henry VIII and Queen Elizabeth I, the story of Greenwich starts here. Catch a glimpse of this former royal home where new renovations allow visitors to see parts of the palace's foundations.



GETTING HERE

By Coach

There is a coach drop off point in Stockwell Street (SE10 9JN) which is a 7-minute walk to the Old Royal Naval College. Alternatively, there is a free coach parking on Norman Road (SE10) and Charlton Way (SE3) or paid coach parking on Park Row/Romney Road (SE10 9NL).

By Car

From the north use M25 via the A2 or M11/A12 Blackwall Tunnel. Please note that there is limited parking in Greenwich, particularly at weekends. Paid car parking is sited in Park Row (SE10 9NL) and Cutty Sark Gardens.

By Tube

Take the Jubilee Line to Canary Wharf and change to the Docklands Light Railway. You can also take the Jubilee Line to North Greenwich (the O2) and then take either bus 188 or 129 which stops on Romney Road.

By Rail

Mainline rail services run from Charing Cross, Waterloo East, Cannon Street, London Bridge and Dartford to Greenwich. Greenwich station is located in Zone 2 and 3 and is a 10-minute walk away from the Old Royal Naval College. Turn left when you leave Greenwich station to head for the town centre. Alternatively you can take the DLR from the station to Cutty Sark for Maritime Greenwich.

By River

Regular riverboat services leave from Westminster, Embankment and Tower Piers to Greenwich Pier. Greenwich Pier is located on the river, a 2-minute walk away from Old Royal Naval College and Visitor Centre.

By DLR

Cutty Sark for Maritime Greenwich. The Old Royal Naval College is a 3-minute walk from the station.
